JODI'S STORY

Jodi and her husband Nick were living in Vietnam in 2008 where Nick was working. Happily together for 12 years, they were having the time of their lives with their two young children.

Nick was away when Jodi rang complaining of constipation, abdominal pain and some bloating. Her doctor quickly recognised an obstruction in her bowel and ordered scans. Jodi had cancer and the tumour had all but blocked her bowel. She was only 39 years old.

After emergency surgery to remove the cancer, Jodi and Nick received the worst news possible – the cancer had spread to Jodi's lymph nodes and liver. At best, she only had two years to live. One of the hardest things was telling their children, Jack and Arabella, that their mum was going to die. Jodi passed away on 16 January 2010, a few days before her 42nd birthday.

Before Jodi's diagnosis she was fit and healthy. She had no family history and no symptoms whatsoever. The saddest part of Jodi's story is that it could have had a different ending if her bowel cancer had been detected early.

With that simple fact as the driving force, the Jodi Lee Foundation was established on 10 August 2010.

The Jodi Lee Foundation is committed to arming Australians with the knowledge they need to prevent bowel cancer and the motivation to be proactive about their health.

Australia has one of the highest rates of bowel cancer in the world. Sadly, bowel cancer is the second leading cause of cancer-related death in Australia and alarmingly the leading cancer killer in 25–34-year-olds. We are passionate about educating Australians to follow up on symptoms, investigate their family history, participate in bowel screening and lead healthy lives so that we can turn these terrible statistics around.

We know that early detection saves lives, and that screening is the most effective tool for early detection. The Australian Department of Health focus their education and screening efforts on the 50-74 age group, sending bowel screening kits through the National Bowel Cancer Screening Program (NBCSP) to this demographic every two years. However only 44% of Australians who receive the test are completing it. This year to promote the importance of the NBCSP we have partnered with the Australian Government to deliver a new awareness campaign: Talking Sh!t. The campaign features Merv Hughes, Gavin Wanganeen, Richard Wilkins, Wendy Harmer and Dr Ginni Mansberg in an online Talking Sh!t show that was broadcast through media and social media, predominately to regional and remote Australians aged 50-74.

We ran our annual Trust Your Gut campaign this year with model Yvonne Tozzi and her two daughters as the faces of the campaign for 2022. This campaign encourages Australians to act on symptoms, speak

to their GP and trust their gut if they feel like something is not right.

The JLF Trek SA was a huge success with 160 participants raising over \$130,000 while walking 72km of the Walk the Yorke trail in Yorke Peninsula. We also held the JLF 300k Step Challenge which encouraged participants to walk 300,000 steps in October 2021.

Other fantastic events included Melbourne Cup at Fishbank Restaurant, movie nights, Burnside Village Christmas wrapping and several supporter events.

We wish to congratulate our Founder & Chair, Nick Lee, on his incredible contribution in the not-for-profit sector which was recognised in the Australia Day Honours when Nick was presented with a Medal of the Order of Australia. The JLF board and staff sincerely thank you for all your incredible work Nick, this Award is well deserved.

The Jodi Lee Foundation would not be where it is today without the support of those who have been affected by bowel cancer, the courage of those wanting to share their story and the generosity and commitment of our valued supporters, sponsors, partners, donors, fundraisers, event participants and volunteers in allowing us to continue to do our important work.

AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS

TRUST YOUR GUT

'Trust Your Gut' is our annual awareness campaign that raises awareness of bowel cancer symptoms, what they are and when to act. We are encouraging you to trust your 'gut feeling' when something doesn't feel right by acting on your symptoms and talking to your GP.

Many of us will experience uncomfortable gut symptoms at one time or another, such as bloating, cramping, gas or unexplained tiredness or weight loss but most of us won't do anything about it.


You might explain it away as being diet related or stress. Some will even Google their symptoms or put it down to not being as young or as fit as they used to be.

Even fewer of us will ask our doctor about our symptoms.

However, it's that 'gut feeling' telling you something is not right which is worth trusting.

Statistically it's unlikely you will have bowel cancer, especially if you are under 50 years of age. However, the critical thing with bowel cancer is to catch it early.

Acting quickly when you first notice symptoms is the key because if detected early, 99% of bowel cancer cases can be successfully treated. In fact, bowel cancer can be present for many years before showing any symptoms. In some cases, people may not experience any bowel cancer symptoms until the cancer has become more advanced or spreads to other parts of the body. It's important to know what's normal for your body and when to talk to your GP.



AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS

TALKING SH!T

After much planning and pivoting from the original concept thanks to COVID, we launched the Talking Sh!t campaign in partnership with the Australian Government Department of Health on 20 June 2022.

Talking Sh!t is a national awareness campaign led by the Jodi Lee Foundation to increase participation in the National Bowel Cancer Screening Program.

Featuring iconic Australian celebrities Merv Hughes, Richard Wilkins, Gavin Wanganeen, Wendy Harmer and GP Dr Ginni Mansberg, the campaign focuses on Australians aged 50-74 years and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged 40 years and over, living in regional and remote Australia.

To get our message across, we created the Talking Sh!t Show and ran digital campaigns across social media to encourage Australians to complete their free National Bowel Cancer Screening Test when it arrives in the mail.

We ran webinars with national GP training organisation GPEx, to educate GPs and health professionals on how they can support and encourage their patients to complete the test.

Posters, brochures and other materials were also delivered to GP practices in regional Australia to be displayed in patient waiting rooms.

To launch the Talking Sh!t Show we held events in Adelaide and Sydney with some of our key media partners, supporters, Ambassadors and the Minister for Health.

We sincerely thank the Department of Health for their support, and to our agency KWPx for their work in delivering this successful campaign.



AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS DEGREES OF SEPARATION

Together with the Sydney Swans, we urged Australians to take the time to take their free, life-saving bowel cancer screening test when it arrives in the mail, through a national television commercial.

We partnered with the Sydney Swans again for our Degrees of Separation awareness campaign. Jodi Lee Foundation ambassadors John Longmire coach of the Sydney Swans, and star player Isaac Heeney shared their story on how bowel cancer has impacted their life. Swans CEO Tom Harley and players Will Hayward and Oliver Florent banded together, united by their connection to bowel cancer, to highlight how close their degrees of separation are, on and off the field with one simple message: 'Take the time, take the test, it might just save your life'.

The television commercial was shown at Adelaide Oval during an AFL match, and social media.



AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS WORKPLACE PROGRAM

The Jodi Lee Foundation Workplace Program gives employers the opportunity to educate their staff about the steps everyone can take to prevent bowel cancer and lead healthy lives.

Every year our Workplace Programs reach hundreds of employees across the country. We encourage employers to purchase bowel screening tests for their employees as part of the program, so they can take active steps to preventing bowel cancer straight away.

NICK LEE OAM

Founder and Chair of the Jodi Lee Foundation, Nick Lee, was awarded The Medal of the Order of Australia for service to the community through the not-for-profit sector and his work in raising awareness for the early detection and prevention of bowel cancer as part of the Australia Day Honours in 2022.

"Being awarded this medal is a huge thrill. It came as a complete surprise. I feel like this is recognition of so much hard work by so many. More importantly, it is recognition of the impact we have had on the lives of Australians over the last 12 years. We have achieved a lot but there is so much more to do.

The fact that bowel cancer is the leading cancer killer in 25 to 34 year-old Australians is unacceptable. Too many people like Jodi are being impacted by this preventable disease. We must change these statistics - there are too many lives at stake. We will continue to fight hard to make this happen."

WESTFIELD, LOCAL HEROES

Thanks to community votes, Nick Lee OAM was named a 2021 Local Hero for Westfield Marion in October 2021.

As part of Nick's recognition, we secured a \$10,000 grant to help support the Foundation's work in the local community. The Jodi Lee Foundation team visited Westfield Marion in June to hand out bowel screening kits to those who are ineligible for the free bowel screening kit from the Australian Government (people outside the 50-74 age group).

The team also assisted those aged 50-74 to re-order kits if they'd lost theirs. Through our activation at Marion and by the centre communicating key messages around the importance of early detection to their shoppers and database, we were able to spread our important messages and make a difference to the community.

TEAM EMILY

A young mother of two, Emily was experiencing frequent gas and bloating, which GPs said was most likely due to her recent C-section or irritable bowel syndrome (IBS). Twelve months after her symptoms first began, Emily experienced a few bouts of stomach cramps and vomiting over a period of several weeks. After CT scans and a colonoscopy, Emily was diagnosed with Stage IV bowel cancer. In 2017 Emily sadly lost her life at just 35 years old.

'Team Emily' participated in The JLF Trek SA for the fifth time to celebrate Emily's life and to raise awareness for early detection of bowel cancer in young adults.

"Team Emily will be back for our 5th trek, celebrating what would be Emily's 40th birthday. Taken too young. We will continue to take part in The JLF Trek as long as we are able to; helping raise awareness of a cause that is very close to our hearts." – Alison from Team Emily.

SOCCER CONSTRUCTION CUP


October 2021







